You must provide the BEST with your name, school, age, and e-mail details if you wish to enter this competition. BEST will only ever use your personal details for the purposes of administering this competition, and will not publish them or provide them to anyone without your permission. 3. Only one entry will be accepted per student, but your school may enter as many student's entries as they like. 4. Deadline for receiving entries is 5pm 11 January 2010. Results will be announced on the day by email and on the BEST website. <http://www.best-schools.org.uk/> 5. The prize is £50 of store tokens (of the winners' choice) to the individual winners – there are THREE prizes AND £450 for your school to start or improve a FILM Academy. 6. The BEST Chief Executive Officer's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into. 7. You agree to take part in any competition publicity if asked to do so. You must supply full details as required above, and comply with all rules to be eligible for the prize(s). No responsibility is accepted for ineligible entries or entries made fraudulently. 9. By submitting your film to BEST you agree to grant the BEST free of charge the right to publish and the right to licence others to publish the photograph online and in all media as required. 10. Your entry must be entirely your own original work, not defame anybody nor breach any copyright. 11. If your film features any person or people, they should be aware they were being filmed and permission should be obtained from all involved (or their parents/guardians if under 16) for their image on the film to be submitted in a competition. If it is clear that the people are not aware of their picture being taken or are embarrassed in any way in any entry we receive, BEST reserves the right to disqualify the entry. 12. This competition is not open to BEST employees or contractors or any person involved in the running of the competition, or their immediate family members. 13. The BEST reserves the right to cancel this competition at any stage, if deemed necessary in its opinion, and if circumstances arise outside its control. 14. If a winning entrant is unable to be contacted after reasonable attempts have been made to do so, the BEST reserves the right to either offer the prize to the next best entry. 15. BEST reserves the right to disqualify any entry which breaches any of these rules or to withhold a prize if in its opinion entries do not reach the required standard.
